- During the lab, it was very helpful that the TA taught how to use the software well and provided hints for how to solve the problem.
- I liked that he cared about student learning because he always set extra time aside when there was major projects coming up, such as the midterm and final. He also sent out friendly reminders which were really helpful. As for the course content, he was very knowledgeable and made sure to not go off tangent. He always had material to keep the students engaged for the whole discussion sections. I guess his weakness would be that he expects his students to know the 'easy' stuff. I understand that if you go to sections students should know the material, but I know some students who were genuinely confused even when they tried their best.
- TA was knowledgable at statistics and was helpful.
- The TA was excellent at explaining lecture material. They did a really good job at explaining problems in discussion. One weakness could be perhaps the really fast pace but he was always available if someone needed more help.
- While the teaching assistant was very knowledgable on the course subject there have been many instances in which the instructor has refused to go over certain materials because he claims that it is "too simple," "no one can fail this," and he won't "waste time on this." His resistance in going over all the material proves to be a problem seeing as the course is an introductory course to the subject taken by a mass amount of non-STEM majors to fulfill GEs and university requirements.
- Zheng was an okay T.A. He would go over labs at a decent pace, however, sometimes he would go faster than usual which would make it difficult to follow through. Sometimes I would get a low score on questions he explained which made no sense because he himself explained to me and worked through the labs with us.
- did not help students, section was very bland and he did not expand upon ideas. he simply repeated statements. he was very knowledgeable but did not teach us well at all. also a little condescending at times.
- the T.A. is well informed about the information he teaches. he helped and went over difficult concepts and gave out tips for studying and what to study. he also helped go over study guide questions for review sessions.
